



From the Pastor . . .

Generosity Sunday is coming soon. On the last Sunday of the month. November 24, we will collect Pledge Cards and consecrate to the Lord the generosity that has been indicated in our responses. While stewardship is often associated with financial commitment to the budget, the concept of stewardship is much greater and deeper than money. Stewardship is about the way we live our lives. It is how we invest our time, talent, and treasure in God's work in the world through the church. Ultimately, this is a matter of faith. Our giving is first and foremost an act of worship. Through our giving, we acknowledge that God is the source of all blessings. Our generosity is a sign of our gratitude for God's good gifts.
